HAPPY 70<sup>th</sup> BIRTHDAY - How many Wessex Federation Club Members realise that the Federation is 70 years of age this year.

The Federation dates from a meeting held at the Rainbow Cafe in Exmouth on 16<sup>th</sup> November 1946. The six clubs present (Exmouth, Exeter, Pinhoe, Plymouth, Torquay and Bath) voted unanimously to form an association of philatelic societies in the South-West of England - the first such association to be founded in Great Britain.

The name "Wessex Philatelic Association" was decided upon, as it covered the area of "Wessex" as defined by Thomas Hardy. The original members were quickly joined by Ilfracombe, Weston-super-Mare, Falmouth, Liskeard, and Sidmouth, and further clubs from Cornwall, Devon, Somerset, and Dorset were added later.

The first Chairman was Mr. Hadfield Craven, a stamp dealer from Torquay, and the first Secretary F. H. (Tommy) Thompson of Exmouth, a Yorkshireman who had spent his life in the Bradford wool trade. Both are names associated with current Wessex competition trophies. The first Wessex annual meeting and exhibition was held at Torquay in June 1947 corresponding with the Jubilee of the Torquay Society.

At this time two exhibitions were held each year, hosted by member clubs in rotation; the Main Exhibition, at which individual competition entries in four adult and three junior categories were displayed, and the Thompson Cup Exhibition for the entries in the interclub competition.

The difficulties of covering such a wide area meant that in the 1970's two further federations were formed. Cornwall Federation and Somerset and Dorset Federation, at this time the Wessex Philatelic Association became the Wessex Philatelic Federation.

Some clubs became members of more than one federation with the Wessex Federation covering mostly the Devon area. The three Federations came together in a biennial exhibition SWIPEX.

Members will recognise the names of both Hadfield Craven and Thompson as they are carried by Trophies still being competed for on an annual basis by members of Wessex Federation Clubs.

Sadly today there are no survivors of the people responsible for starting the Federation and no photographs to record the event, we only have a copy of the minutes from which the above information was put together.

Wessex Philatelic Federation 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary was far better recorded. The federation minutes show that a number of clubs arranged to make displays following the suggestion by Lesley Hampton of Exmouth Club that the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Event should be held in Exmouth the town where the inaugural meeting took place. Following this a sub-committee was set up to run the event and feed information

back to the clubs. The sub-committee consisted of Jim Wigmore (Federation Chairman), Pearl Buxton (Federation Secretary), Ron Elliott (Federation Treasurer) and Leslie Hampton (Exmouth Club Representative). It was realised that the federation would not be able to fund such an event from its own funds. It was agreed that The Pavillions at Exmouth would be an ideal venue, they would produce a commemorative post card to be posted at Exmouth, it should represent the clubs taking part, a copy of which would go to each attendee, a Commemorative Cake should be produced, to be cut on the day with all attendees given a piece.

In order to fund the event attending clubs were asked to make donations, clubs donating were Bideford, Mid-Devon, Exeter, Liskeard, Torquay, Taw & Torridge, Exmouth Dawlish along with Sums given by Wessex Bulletin, Bideford Club Auction, and individual donations to the total sum of £251.50. When the costs for the day were subtracted a small profit of £22.09 was passed to the federation account.

The sub committee in conjunction with the various clubs allocated times for displays, speakers only being allowed to talk for 5 -10 min's.




The 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Meeting actually took place on 30<sup>th</sup> November 1996 between 10.30 am until 4.30 pm. Many of the clubs organised mini-buses or coaches to bring members a wives/friends with displays being given by Bideford, Dawlish, Exeter, Exmouth, Liskeard, Mid-Devon, Tiverton, Torquay and WETS.

The Commemorative Cake was in the form of a letter with a 50p Machin Stamp, see the picture of Jim Wigmore (Chairman) and the section of cake with the stamp on as reproduced in the Exmouth Express & Echo.

Exmouth Club had made arrangements for the commemorative post cards to handed in to Exmouth Post Office hand cancelled with the Exmouth H/Stamp and dispatched to the various addressee's, see the copy reproduced. It was a splendid day much talked about at the time and still remembered fondly by those who attended.

## Liskeard Stamp Club Report,

**30<sup>th</sup> September 2015** Richard Wiggins entertained us with his display "1492 And All That"; Richard gave a very interesting display and his knowledge of the subjects was amazing.

28<sup>th</sup> October 2015 Peter Epps gave us a comprehensive display of "Ireland" it was most interesting to have one of our own members give a display on a subject not often seen.

25<sup>th</sup> November 2015 The "Wessex Road Show" was presented by Martin Ellam, a fantastic display of material submitted by members from many federation clubs and as always it was very entertaining.

14<sup>th</sup> December 2015 WE held our Christmas Meal fourteen were booked but only thirteen were able to attended, we enjoyed the company of fellow members and partners, some past member were also invited. The event was much enjoyed by all.

16<sup>th</sup> December 2015 Last month a lady gave the club a stock book of stamps which we sold this month in a silent auction raising £9 for club funds. We ran a one sheet competition and had twenty six entries being won by David Richards and Jim Parsons jointly. We were pleasantly surprised by the number of entries. This was followed by mince pies cream and Christmas cake supplied by Janet Parsons and Sally and Martin Ellam. Members followed this by varied displays made up of a 160 pages in total a marvellous end to our year.

#### **Launceston Stamp Club**

**September 2015 meeting** was devoted to Postcards. The evening dealers Jim Fisher and Tony Lucas offered a wide range of regional and local postcards together with a selection of stamps and GB First Day covers.

Diane Lawer, from the Plymouth Postcard Collectors Club gave a history of the Cornish Pasty as recorded on Picture Postcards from the early 1900's to the present day. Diane's collection of postcards was displayed as a Power Point presentation enabling her to show each postcard and provide a running commentary.

October 2015 Meeting - AGM and Autumn Auction, starting with the Club's AGM.

The Auction of 262 lots followed, with Rex Eccott acting as Auctioneer, ably assisted by Viv Sandercock and Mike Tooley showing and distributing the lots with David Richards and Des Kent recording the sales. A total of £561.95 was realised, with £60 being paid for a Northern Nigerian collection.

**November 2015 meeting** - .The trader for the evening was Rex Eccott. The Secretary welcomed the twenty-five members present and introduced our guests from the Taw & Torridge Club who would be providing the evening's entertainment.

Peter Harris introduced his team members and their specialities; Beryl Lloyd - Gibraltar and Malta; Lee Styles -Czechoslovakia; Andrew Austin – National Parks. Peter explained that Andrew was unable to be present. Finally, Peter's own presentation of his personal collection of photographic reminisces and their look-alike stamp issues.

**December 2015 meeting** - The trading session of stamps and covers was by Viv and Evelyn Sandercock. The evening's Speaker was Club member Roger Winn who introduced his collection of postcards from WW1. The evening's display was nearly 70 postcards from the period up to 1916 and included examples of ships of the line and tramp steamers, stylised coloured photo-prints of flowers and simple home scenes, family messages to and from home and iconic "On Active Service" postcards from soldiers at the Front. Roger pointed out that families (and sweethearts) would often use word codes to conceal personal messages in their correspondence.

#### **Dawlish Stamp Club**

**October 2015** – The clubs Auction Night went very well with some very lively bidding in the room and some significant post auction sales. There were some very happy vendors many of who donated their few unsold lots to the club as an additional thank you for the work carried out in selling their lots.

**November 2015** – Members brought along a number of displays and this was followed by some very lively bring and buy transactions that also included most of the donated lots from the previous auction, the sale of which helped the clubs funds.

**December 2015** – This meeting was very well attended with member's partners also attending to enjoy our annual Christmas Party. Chairman David Chattock had once again thought up a fiendish quiz to tax everyone's brains, despite which everyone had a very jolly time.
