



incoming mail. Just ask yourself, when was it you looked in any other parts of a dealers stock, other than the country you are actually interested in. Many years ago when attending the Cornish Federation Fair at Liskeard, one of my friends aware of my interest in Cyprus drew me over to a dealer specialising in Russia to show me some postal history he had addressed to Cyprus, these items were real gems. One of the items is reproduced above and right. It can be seen that it is addressed to a well known lady Miss Michell who was the daughter of the British Representative in Limassol. The rear of postcard also shows that she was a philatelist as the text starts "This is just for the sake of your album". There was another item from the same correspondence which was acquired at the same time. Sometimes when acquiring such items we do not always know what we have got.

I acquired another cover through the Cyprus Study Circle packet, the original owner like me did not know what he had and had not looked at the postmark and done his homework. The cover is reproduced below, it originated in the Chinese Province of Manchuria however the postmark actually reads MANCHOUKOU and dated 20.5.38. The reason for this is that the Japanese overran

Manchuria in 1932 and changed the name. I of course was totally unaware of these events, to me it was a rather plain cover from an odd location hence my interest.

Another friend knowledgeable in Chinese Philately asked me one day did I realise what I had "not really said I", "you have a very rare cover there and explained why, any time you wish to get rid of it I want first refusal said he". He has not got it, yet.

**AFGHANISTAN** - With the Government announcing that British troops will be leaving Afghanistan during 2014, it's hard to realize that our soldiers have been fighting in this mountainous, landlocked, Asian country for almost 150 years.

Conformation comes with this 1880 postcard from an Army captain to his wife in London.

On the rear of the card, the officer speaks of "a 22 days forced-march" to break a siege at Kandahar

and relieve a siege on the garrison.

With little official mail censoring in those days he was able to write about "his army giving 20,000 Afghans a jolly good licking.

This conflict, 1878-81, is known as the Second Afghan War. The First (1838-42) came when the Britain became concerned over Ahmed Shah Abdali moving towards links with Russia and Persia and felt this meant a threat to the Indian border.

Conflicts of differing degree's continued, the last in 1919 as Afghans fought both foreigners and among themselves.








There last king was deposed in 1973, republics of various strength followed and the 1988-9 government faced civil war as Islamic fighters grew in strength. As Queen Victoria appeared on letters and postcards which carried messages back to Britain, Afghanistan's first stamp — referred to as the "Afghan Tiger' — is officially dated as 1871 based on Moslem


calendar dates encircling the Tiger". (Some of our older members may well remember being shown these stamps by the late Oliver Cumming, he used to relate how he was able to purchase them from a dealer in The Strand, London for a very small sum, since they were unaware of what they were and anyway they were all torn. Because of the method of printing and issuing, this was the norm.)

Like most modern nations Afghanistan regularly issues stamps, they even had an American philatelic agency in the 1960s. The 2001 destruction of the World Trade Centre in New York brought another war and death to Afghan









The International Encylopedia of Stamps caught my eye at a recent auction. It was Part 1 Volume 1 costing 4/6 at the launching in 1970.
